Provided Always, and these presents are upon this condition, that whereas the said James L. Gerrish is indebted to the said James H. Sanger in the sum of Two hundred Dollars, payable on the twenty fifth day of February, in the year Eighteen hundred and Eighty, with interest from date of note given February twenty fifth 1879.

The debt is for money loaned to J. L. Gerrish by James H. Sanger.

Now if the said James L. Gerrish shall punctually pay said sum of money with the interest when the same shall become due then this conveyance to be void; otherwise to be in full force. The said James L. Gerrish is to retain possession of said property until said debt becomes due and upon default of payment of said moneys, shall redeliver the said property to the said James H. Sanger.
