GENERAL POWER OF ATTORNEY

I, Ralph K. White of Lake County, State of Indiana, do hereby make, constitute and appoint John VanPuffelen

of Raleigh County, State of West Virginia, my true and lawful attorney in fact, for me and in my name, place and stead to make and indorse promissory notes; to draw and indorse checks; to draw, accept and indorse bills of exchange; to waive demand, presentment, protest, notice of protest, and notice of nonpayment of all such instruments; to make and execute any and all contracts; to purchase, sell, dispose of, assign and pledge notes, stocks, bonds and securities; to exercise such voting rights as my ownership of any notes, stocks, bonds and securities may entitle me, either in person or by proxy; to represent me in all matters pertaining to the business of any corporation in which I may have any interest; to receive and to demand all sums of money, debts, dues, accounts, legacies, bequests, interest, dividends, annuities, and demands whatsoever, as are now or shall hereafter become due, owing, payable or belonging to me; to compromise the same; to make acquittances or other sufficient discharges for the same; to bargain for, contract concerning, buy, sell, mortgage, hypothecate, and in any and every way and manner deal in and with personal property; to execute instruments necessary for the transfer of personal property of any kind or nature whatsoever; to execute instruments to effect the transfer of title to any motor vehicle owned by me; to purchase, sell, mortgage, convey and lease any interest in real estate, wherever located, of which I may be owner now or hereafter; to execute and file all tax returns of any kind or nature whatsoever, whether the same be required by the United States, any political subdivision thereof or any foreign government, and to pay such taxes; to examine and request copies of any tax returns heretofore or hereafter filed by me or for and in my behalf; to take all lawful means deemed desirable by my said attorney in fact to enforce my rights or to protect my property, including the institution, prosecution, compromise and settlement of legal proceedings, in my name or otherwise; and generally to transact any and all business for me of any kind or nature whatsoever; to do and perform each and every act and thing whatsoever requisite and necessary or proper to be done in all matters affecting my business or property, and with the same force and effect as though I were personally present and acting for myself; and I hereby ratify and confirm all that my said attorney in fact shall do by virtue hereof. I hereby reserve the right of revocation; however, this Power of Attorney shall continue in full force and effect until:

I have executed and recorded in the Recorder's Office of the county of my domicile a written revocation hereof, six (6) months have elapsed from the date hereof, whichever occurs first.
