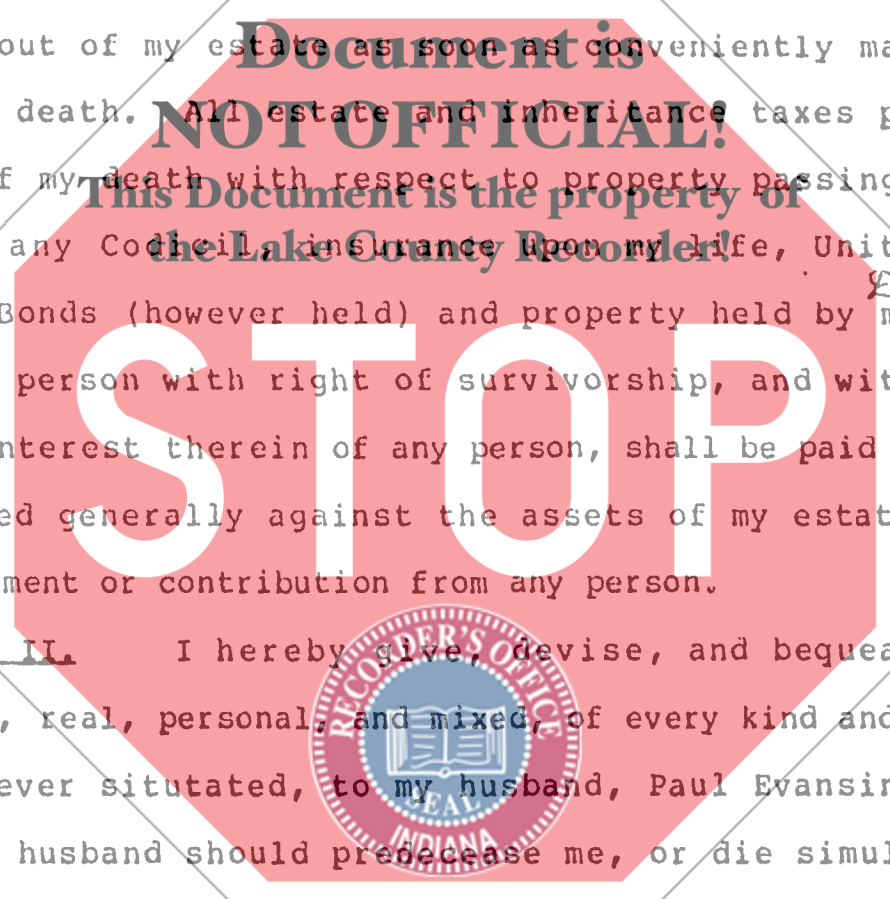
ITEM I. I hereby direct that my Executor pay all my just debts, including the expenses of my last illness, funeral and burial, out of my estate as soon as conveniently may be done after my death. All estate and inheritance taxes payable by reason of my death with respect to property passing under my Will or any Codicil, insurance upon my life, United States Savings Bonds (however held) and property held by <sup>D.M.E.</sup> me jointly with any person with right of survivorship, and with respect to the interest therein of any person, shall be paid out of and be charged generally against the assets of my estate, without reimbursement or contribution from any person.

ITEM II. I hereby give, devise, and bequeath all my property, real, personal, and mixed, of every kind and character and wherever situated, to my husband, Paul Evansin. In the event my husband should predecease me, or die simultaneously with me, then and in either of said events, I do hereby give, devise, and bequeath all my said property as follows:

A. I bequeath all of my Jewelry, my Bronze collection and my Roseplate collection equally to my grandchildren, who are presently living in Midland, Texas.

B. All of the rest and residue of my property, I hereby give, devise, and bequeath to my son, David P. Evansin, of Midland, Texas.

C. If my son should predecease me, his share, under this my Last Will and Testament shall go to my then-living grandchildren.

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ITEM III. In the event of the death of my husband and myself simultaneously, or in such a manner as to come within the provisions of the Act known as the Uniform Simultaneous Death Act (Acts of 1941, Chapter 49, Burns Indiana Statutes Annotated, I.C. 29-2-14-1, et.seq, as amended), but for the provisions made in the Last Wills and Testaments of my said husband and myself, then and in said event it is my specific direction that said Act shall not apply and that in such event it shall be conclusively presumed that my husband survived me, and that all property of my husband and myself otherwise falling within the provisions of said Act shall be treated as own solely by my husband, and shall pass under my said husband's Last Will and Testament. In no event shall there be two separate estates administered in the event that my husband and I should die so as to come within the provision of said Acts as to the property we own jointly.

ITEM IV. I hereby nominate and appoint my husband, Paul Evansin, as Executor of this my Last Will and Testament. In the event my husband should be unable to, or refuses to, act as such Executor, then I hereby appoint James P. Woods, Sr., of Crown Point, Indiana as Executor of this my Last Will and Testament. Said Executor shall serve without bond, except as otherwise provided by law.

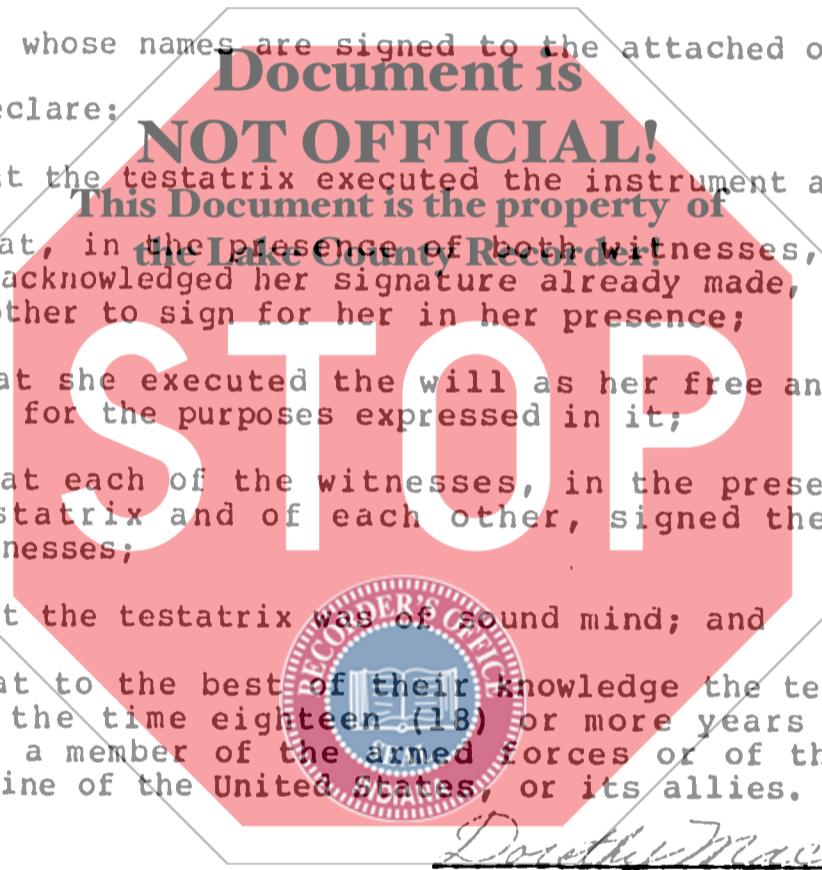

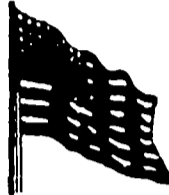
