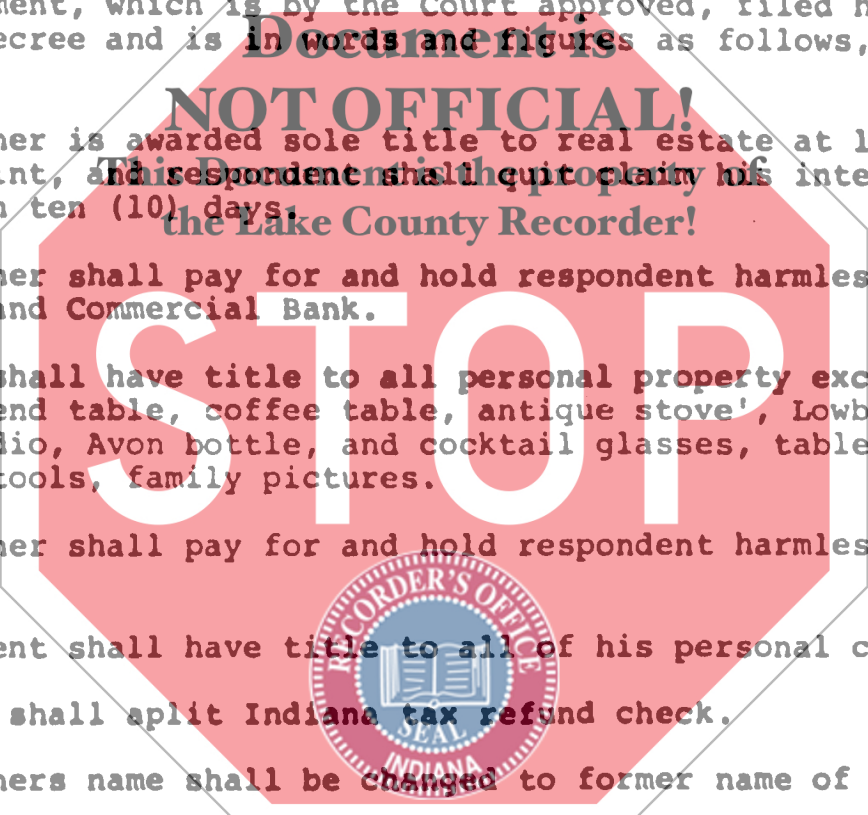
Comes now Respondent James A. Sumpter in person and by counsel, Richard L. Mayer.

Thereupon this cause is now submitted to the Court for hearing and trial, without the intervention of a jury, and the Court having heard the evidence thereon and being duly advised in the premises now finds that the marriage of June Irene Sumpter and James A. Sumpter is irrevocably broken and that the said marriage is hereby dissolved and the parties are restored to the state of unmarried persons.

Petitioner former name of June Irene White is hereby restored to petitioner.

Court further finds that parties hereto have entered into a property settlement agreement, which is by the Court approved, filed herein, made a part of this decree and is in words and figures as follows, to-wit: (H.I.).

1. Petitioner is awarded sole title to real estate at 187 Harrington Street, Crown Point, and Respondent shall quitclaim his interest to petitioner within ten (10) days.
2. Petitioner shall pay for and hold respondent harmless on Calumet Securities bill and Commercial Bank.
3. Petitioner shall have title to all personal property except respondent shall have bed, end table, coffee table, antique stove, Lowboy chest, Stereo, clock radio, Avon bottle, and cocktail glasses, table lamp, speakers, CB and Antenna, tools, family pictures.
4. Petitioner shall pay for and hold respondent harmless on Visa, and Sears.
5. Respondent shall have title to all of his personal clothing items.
6. Parties shall split Indiana tax refund check.
7. Petitioner's name shall be changed to former name of June Irene White.
