I, Ted W. ARTICLE IV

In the event my beloved wife should predecease me, or if we should die as a result of a common accident, then in such event I hereby devise and bequeath all the rest, residue and remainder of my property and estate, both real and personal, of whatever nature or wheresoever situated and whensoever acquired, to have and to hold the same absolutely, unto my beloved children, Patricia Haraminac and Theresa Harrison, in equal shares, share and share alike, provided they survive me.

In the event either of my aforementioned beloved children should predecease me, then I hereby devise and bequeath the share that would have been taken by said deceased child to the issue of said child. In the event either of my aforementioned beloved children should predecease me leaving no issue surviving her, then
