



**Legal Description:** Part of the South Half of the Southeast Quarter of Section 6, Township 36 North, Range 7 West of the Second Principal Meridian, in Lake county, Indiana, commencing at the Southeast corner of Section 6, Township and Range aforesaid, running thence North along the East line of said Section, 156 feet; thence Westerly in a direct line to a point in the West line of the Southeast Quarter of said Section 6, 132.4 feet North of the Southwest corner of said Quarter Section; thence South along said Quarter Section line 132.4 feet to the Southeast corner thereof; thence East along the South line of said Quarter Section 6, Township and Range aforesaid to the place of beginning.

**EXCEPT:**

A parcel of land in Section 6, Township 36 North, Range 7, West of the Second Principal Meridian, in the City of Gary, Lake County, Indiana, consisting of a portion of the Wabash Railroad, Original Deed found in Deed Record 61, page 208, in the Lake County Recorder's Office and described as the East 1440.97 feet, more or less, of said Deed Record, with a 12 inch Amoco Pipeline as shown, with the West frontage on dedicated Lake Street and described as beginning at the Southeast corner of Section 6, Township 36 North, Range 7, West of the Second Principal Meridian as marked by a "T" rail; thence West on the South line of said Section 6, which also is the South line of the City of Gary, for a distance of 1440.98 feet to the East line of dedicated Lake Street; thence North on the East line of dedicated Lake Street, for a distance of 150.0 feet to the North line of said Deed Record 61, page 208; thence East on said North line of Deed Record 61, page 208, for a distance of 1440.97 feet to the East line of said Section 6; thence South on the East line of said Section 6 and the Point of Beginning, containing 5.061 acres, more or less.
